Sunday's Reflection: **DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME – WE REMEMBER**

Scripture: Deuteronomy 8.2-3, 14-16; Psalm 147; 1Corinthians 10. 16-17; John 6.51-59

Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (*Corpus Christi*). St. Thomas Aquinas called this sacrament "*tantum sacramentum*", the awesome sacrament. In the Holy Eucharist, we have the nourishment for our minds, hearts, and spirits. Here we are called to experience the abiding presence of Christ with us.

We have scriptural foundation for this so awesome a sacrament. Moses reminded the people that God directed their journey throughout the desert and when they thought they would die of starvation, God provided them with manna, a heavenly substance that nourished the body and renewed the soul. It was something they never had before (Deut.8.2-3, 14-16). The second reading is on the *cup of blessing that we bless and the bread that we break. Because the loaf of bread is one, we who are many are one body, for we partake of the one loaf (1 Cor.10.16-17)*. In the Gospel, Jesus has explained to the people the new "manna" which nourishes and sustains in the spiritual being of its partakers (John 6.51-59).

Celebration of the feast of Corpus Christi is the **celebration of Christ living among us**. Jesus wanted to be with his disciples forever as he loved the world so much. On the eve of his death, he gave us two signs that are renewed every year in the liturgy. First, the sign of the washing of the apostles' feet, through which Jesus left his friends an example of love that reveals itself in humble, concrete service. Second, Jesus consecrated bread and wine as the sacrament of his Body and his Blood, thus instituting the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

"Do this in memory of me". These words of Jesus after the Last Supper, tell us that the heart of the Eucharist is **remembrance**. To remember is to bring the heart back in memory and affection and it becomes a celebration of the presence of the person or the event. Jesus asked us to remember his words, teachings, actions, his sufferings, death and resurrection, ascension, and the promise of his second coming. This remembrance today for us is not something like a vague memory of a person lived long ago, but it is, and must be, a real, life giving presence that shall transform us. Holy Eucharist is a sign and source of our love, service, and unity. We form a single body, the Church, because we all share in the one loaf and we drink of the one cup.
