## Sunday’s Reflection: **LORD, SEND FORTH YOUR SPIRIT**

*Scripture: Acts 2.1-11; Psalm 104.1ab+24ac, 29b-30, 31+34(R.30); 1 Corinthians 12.3b-7, 12-12; John 20.19-23*

On the day of Pentecost, the 50<sup>th</sup> day after the Resurrection of the Lord, being true to His promise, Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to the apostles who were wounded by doubt, grief, fear, failure, sadness, and a sense of inadequacy. The descending of the Holy Spirit transformed their lives. The people gathered were amazed and astonished and they all experienced the power of God (Acts.2.1-11). This was the beginning of a new community, a community of believers with a mission entrusted to them by Christ the Head of the community of people (1Cor.12.3-7, 12-13). This was the birthday of the Church.

Although the Spirit is invisible to our eyes, it is described with meaningful and powerful images of wind and fire (Acts 2.1-11). Yet the Holy Spirit is as profoundly real as the fruits of the tree. When St. Paul spoke about the fruits of the Spirit (Gal.5.22-23) he was talking about the visible flowering of the Spirit in a person’s life. We may not be able to see the Holy Spirit, but we can see the impact of the Spirit on our lives. Whenever we experience the love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control, the Spirit is made visible in and through these qualities and virtues in us. The Spirit thus empowers us to act and we become instruments of His love, peace, and joy.

On that first Pentecost, there was a wonderful communion between people from all over the Roman Empire. Despite differences of language and culture there was a profound communion among them. Wherever we find such a communion of hearts and minds among those who are strikingly different, there the Holy Spirit is at work and it binds us together irrespective of all kinds of differences that exist.

The Spirit is *parakletos* (Comforter / Counselor) (Jn.14.16), a helper, a teacher, a guide, a replacement for Christ himself. “It is for your own good that I am going, because unless I go, the *Paraclete* will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you” (Jn 16:7). Before the coming of the Spirit, the apostles were timid and afraid like children huddling together in a storm. After the descending of the Spirit upon them they were utterly transformed, and they were never the same again. The Spirit would stay in the bloodstream of those people “who were all together in one place” (Acts 2.1). The Spirit was there with them as their helper, counsellor, comforter, teacher, and guide at those moments they had taken decisions, those times they struggled and suffered, those hours of making crucial choices, and at every moment of their life journey.

Lord, send forth your Spirit. Burn the unspiritual in me in the fire of love. Heal all kinds of wounds that block me. Wash away the stain of guilt in me. Pour water on those areas of dryness in my life. Bend my stubborn heart and will so that I see the goodness in others. Renew my strength, transform, and transfigure me into the image of Christ by the Holy Spirit (2Cor.3.18). Our life shall be a constant Pentecost when we undergo the process of renewal and changes take place in us. Lord, send forth your Spirit.
