## Sunday's Reflection: JESUS GAVE HIS LIFE IN HUMBLE SERVICE OF HIS PEOPLE

Scripture: Isaiah 53.10-11; Psalm 33.4-5,18-19,20+22(R.22); Hebrews 4.14-16; Mark 10.35-45

Jesus founded the Church on rock like faith. "...you are Peter, and on this rock, I will build my church" (Mt. 16.18). The path of following Christ and the Church is not of power and greatness, but of sacrifice and cross which enable one to love and serve others. It is so vital that He offered himself as an example and said that He has not come to the world to lord it over others, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many. He directly revealed this reality to the apostles James and John and others: "...but it is not so among you, whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant...For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk.10. 43-45).

Dedication to the service of others is fundamental to Christian discipleship. Jesus came "not to be served, but to serve" and this example must be a guiding light for his followers. He went about doing good (cf. Acts 10:38), bringing justice, healing, forgiveness and kindness. Those who believe in him are challenged to give themselves, their talents and their time, to the service of others, convinced that this is the right way to live.

The goodness of Jesus was always radiant with the loving service he extended to the weak and the needy of his time. This is the legacy that Jesus has left for us and he wants it to be passed down through our loving service to others. It is the same lesson of service that he continues to teach his disciples through his Word, our celebration of the Holy Eucharist and the various ministries in the Church.

The sons of Zebedee, James and John, were ambitious. Power and glory were the paths they wished to follow. Such false and selfish ambitions may hurt the persons and destroy harmony within the community. Selfish ambition will always be for greatness and is condemned by Jesus. Jesus, the Teacher, wanted to correct the attitude of his disciples and said, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all" (Mk. 10.44). What makes the passion of Christ unique is its saving role through service.

A true disciple needs to renounce his/her own ambition and think of the good of others. True ambition is to serve others with the single purpose of the greatness and welfare of the people. The best service is the service to the weak and the marginalized: "As long as you did this to the least of my brethren you did it to me...." (Mt. 25.40). Jesus reminds us again today that true greatness lies in service of others. Though he was in the form of God, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave (Phil. 2:6ff). We are his disciples and we are called "to serve and not to be served". For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Mk.10. 45).
