## LITURGY OF THE WORD 2024-2025

### SUNDAY: YEAR C -Year of Luke

### WEEKDAY - YEAR 1

#### **First Reading:** (*Malachi 4.1-2l*).

For evildoers, the Day of the Lord will be a day of judgment, but for the upright it will be a day of salvation.

#### **Responsorial Psalm:**

“The Lord is coming to judge the peoples with equity”.

#### **Second Reading:** (*2 Thess 3:7-12*).

As far as possible, all should try to earn the food they eat.

#### **Gospel:** (*Lk 21:5-19*).

The Gospel message is to respond adequately with faith and hope to the present difficulties and realities in life and go forward with the conviction of what is to come. “By your endurance you will gain your souls”.

## LOOK BEYOND OUR LIFE SITUATIONS TODAY. “BY YOUR ENDURANCE YOU WILL GAIN YOUR SOULS”. (LK.21.19)

Malachi 4.1-2; Psalm 98.5- 9; 2 Thessalonians 3.7-12; Luke 21.5-19

This is the final Sunday of the liturgical year, and the Word of God reminds us of the last things, the ‘end things’, the second coming of Christ (*Parousia*) as a reminder to live our lives in the light of eternity, a life filled with hope today and a life after death. The liturgy of this Sunday invites us to look beyond our immediate worries, interests and the selfish concerns which trouble us now and place our trust and hope in God. “But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings” (Malachi 4:1-2).

Jesus used two **contrasting images** in today’s gospel. The first is a series of **frightening events**. He delivered it before the Temple of Jerusalem, a building admired by the people for its grandeur and splendor. He prophesied that all the beauty of the Temple, that grandeur – “the day will come when not one stone will be left upon another; all will be thrown down...Nation will rise against nation; kingdom against kingdom; great earthquakes; famines and plagues; persecutions; betrayals...” (Lk.21.6ff) Here we shall have a realistic look at history, marked by calamity and by violence. Think of the many wars and so many catastrophes today and all that wound the creation, our common home, and the human families that live there. It is alarming and frightening.

The second image is the reassuring words of Jesus. He tells us what attitude the Christian should adopt in living under such a situation characterized by violence and adversity. The word of prophet Malachi is comforting: “But for you who revere my name, the sun of righteousness shall rise, with healing in its wings” (Malachi 4:1-2). The words of Jesus are reassuring: “I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict...But not a hair of your head will perish. By your endurance you will gain your souls”. What must be our Christian attitude in similar situations? It is the attitude of hope in God, which allows us not to be overwhelmed by tragic events. Indeed, they are “*a time to bear witness*” (Lk.21.13).

The Gospel message is to respond adequately with faith and hope to the present difficulties and realities in life and go forward with the conviction of what is to come. “By your endurance you will gain your souls”. (Lk.21.19).

We proclaim that mystery of faith at every eucharistic celebration “We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection until you come again.” Our preparations, therefore, should have all three comings in mind.
