LITURGY OF THE WORD 2024-2025

SUNDAY: YEAR C -Year of Luke WEEKDAY - YEAR 1

First Reading: (Ezekiel 47.1-2,8-9, 12).
A powerful symbol of God's life-giving grace, healing, and the new covenant in Jesus Christ. The water, which becomes life-giving wherever it flows.

Responsorial Psalm:
"The streams make glad the city of God,
the habitation of the Most High."

Second Reading: (1 Cor. 3.9-17).
Jesus Christ is the sole foundation of the Church, built upon by apostles and other ministers who must be careful in their work. The Church is a holy place because the Holy Spirit indwells it. This is a call to recognize the sacredness of the community and to live in a way that respects this divine presence.

Gospel: (John 2.13-22).
Jesus is speaking of the "temple of his Body," referring to his death and resurrection. This clarifies that the true dwelling place of God is not a physical building, but Jesus himself, and by extension, the Church, which is his living body on earth.



CHURCH, THE SACRAMENT. CHRIS IN OUR MIDST HOLDS US AND THE WORLD TOGETHER.

Ezekiel 47:1-12; Psalm 46:2--9; 1 Corinthians 3:9 -17; John 2:13-22

We celebrate the Dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome. It is the oldest of the four major basilicas in Rome and serves as the official seat of the bishop of Rome, the Pope. It is the symbol of unity in the Roman Catholic Church and is considered as the "mother church" of all the churches in the world. It has a long history. The original Lateran was built by the emperor Constantine in the fourth century over an ancient Roman palace, the Lateran. The baptistry was dedicated to St. John the Baptist and thus the church bears the name of St. John the Lateran. The structure has been destroyed and rebuilt several times over the centuries, and its history is the record of survival and endurance. This Sunday we celebrate the feast of dedication of the Basilica of St. John Lateran in Rome.

Have you ever attended the dedication of a church? In so many ways, it echoes the sacrament of baptism like the blessing of the baby, baptizing with holy water, and anointing with chrism. The baby is now baptized and has become a "new creation, reborn to everlasting life." In the dedication of the church, the building is sprinkled with holy water; the doors are marked with sign of the cross; the altar is anointed with holy chrism; the tabernacle is installed in the proper place, and the church building is sacred and holy and a place of worship now.

This Sunday, on the feast of the Dedication of Basilica of St. John Lateran we reflect on this great symbol of our faith, the holiness of the church and our responsibility to keep church holy and sacred. It is in this spirit we understand the Gospel of St. John and the dramatic account of Jesus' cleansing of the Temple in Jerusalem. He drove out its merchants and moneychangers with moral indignation at the unjust commercialization of a House of Prayer and the exploitation of the poor pilgrims in the name of religion. "Stop making my father's house a marketplace" (Zechariah 14:21).

The sacredness and holiness are reflected in the words of Ezekiel, describing the water flowing from the temple, nourishing everything around it. A church building is brick and mortar, wood, and glass. But it is the people. St. Paul (1 Corinthians 3:9-17) tells us: You are the temple of God and the Spirit dwells in you... The passage also highlights that the Church community, and each individual believer, is the living temple of God, where the Holy Spirit dwells, and must be protected from destruction by false teaching or immoral conduct.

So, this weekend, we are reminded that we are the "living stones" that make up the church. Like the Lateran, we have been consecrated to stand before the world as landmarks for Christ. In a sense, we are the doors through which people can enter a closer relationship with him. We are the windows that shine forth the light of Christ's love. Church is the Sacrament as it signifies the presence of a living God. Christ lives in our midst. He alone holds us our world together. He is the one who draws us to this church. He is the one who nourishes our hopes and calms our fears. It is he who welcomes us always with all our flaws and imperfections. The sacred space, the tabernacle, Christ in the Holy Eucharist is the centre of this church. We are the church, the people of God, the living stones. We are duty bound to keep the sacredness and holiness of the church, House of God.
