SUNDAY: YEAR A WEEKDAY - YEAR 1

First Reading: (Ex 34:4-6.8-9).

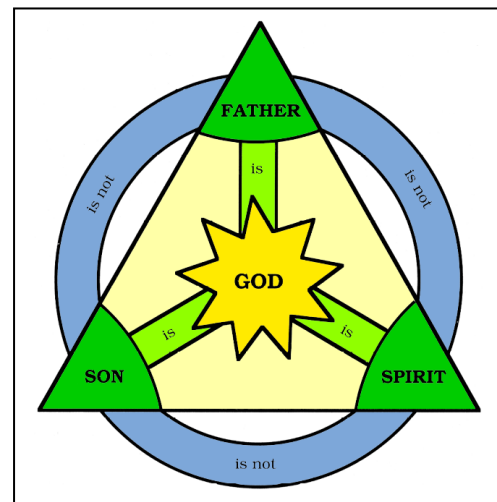
God reveals himself to Moses on Mount Sinai as a God who is faithful to his promises and rich in tenderness and compassion.

Second Reading: (2 Cor 13:11-13).

Paul encourages the Corinthians to live in peace and love. The reading contains a trinitarian blessing which is used as a greeting at Mass.

Gospel: Gospel (Jn 3:16-18).

God has shown his love for us by sending his Son to save all of us. All who believe in him will be saved.



HOLY TRINITY: LOVE, COMMUNION, AND COMMUNICATION

Exodus 34.4b-9; Daniel 3.52 - 56; 2 Corinthians 13.11-13; John 3.16-18

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Trinity, the mystery of God's love which is outside the reach of time and beyond the grasp of human reasoning. The readings present the inner reality of the Triune God- the inter-relating mystery of Love. God is "so merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love" (Exodus 34: 6). The Trinitarian blessing formula, "the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with all of you" (1 Corinthians 13:13) powerfully manifests the totality of Divine love. Our God is the one who "so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life" (John 3:16-18).

We believe in the three Persons of the Trinity, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Together they represent the fullness of love. The Father loves the Son, the Son loves the Father, the Holy Spirit is their love for each other. God the Father created us, his Son saved us, and the Holy Spirit continues to guide us. The foundation of Holy Trinity is love and our lives should reflect the Trinity by ways of being creative like the Father, compassionate like his Son, and sharing our talents in the service of others like the Holy Spirit. Out of love God sent his Son. Jesus showed his love through his ministry on earth and by his death and resurrection. And the death and resurrection brought us the love of the Holy Spirit.

For us Christians, the Trinity is the primary symbol of a community. It signifies love, unity, relationships, communion, and communication. These are the hallmarks of the very life of Godhead – the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We shall pray for the grace to make these priorities and hallmarks of the Holy Trinity as our own for we are a community of believers, the Church. The Trinitarian community of persons is one with the communicating and uniting power of the total love that exists among the Triune God, the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. Trinitarian life therefore is a life of love, communication, relationship, and affection. The quality of our Christian life is based on the imitation of the interior life of the Trinity. Trinity is the model for every human community, from the simplest and elemental, which is the family, to the universal Church.

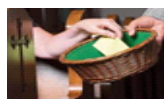

The encyclical - the official letter from the Pope addressed to the entire Church and the people of goodwill on a matter of serious urgency- *Magnifica Humanitas* ("Magnificent Humanity") is Church's response to one of the defining issues of the modern age: artificial intelligence and the rapid expansion of digital technology.

Pope Leo acknowledges the tremendous benefits that artificial intelligence, robotics, and digital systems can offer society, particularly in medicine, communication, education, and scientific advancement. Yet he repeatedly warns against allowing efficiency, profit, and technological power to overshadow human dignity and moral responsibility.

The encyclical has a clear message that technology must serve the human person, not replace or dominate him. Pope Leo XIV is not asking us to oppose or resist or fear new technology or updated working methods. He is asking us to remain profoundly human; to ask hard questions; to resist the slow drift toward a world where efficiency replaces compassion, where data replaces dignity, and where the logic of profit replaces the logic of love.

"You might not be a theologian. You might not read Vatican documents. But if you own a smartphone, use social media, worry about your future, care about justice, or are simply trying to live your faith in a world that feels increasingly confusing and inhuman, this encyclical was written for you."
