RESPONSE OF JESUS TO PEOPLE LIVING LIKE A ‘SHEEP WITHOUT A SHEPHERD’

Exodus.19.1-6; Psalm 100; Romans 5.6-11; Matthew 9:36-10.8

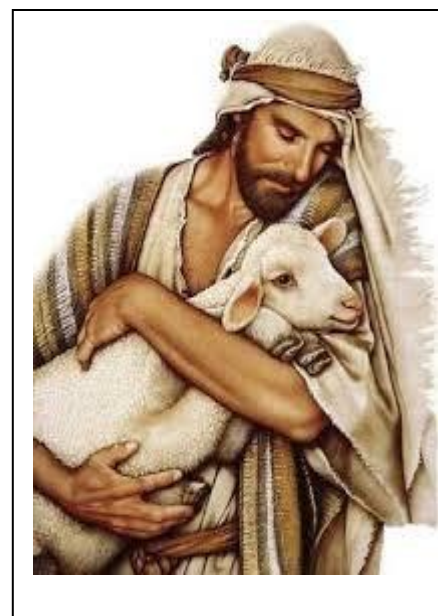
In Jesus we find a Man for others, who positively responded to the needs of the people of his time. Follow up of the transforming works suitable to the world situation of today is the task of the Church, the people of God. Having understood the situation, Jesus chose and sent the twelve apostles to continue his mission of extending the loving care to the people. He reminded the apostles that the harvest is very plentiful, but the laborers are few.

Jesus prayed before he chose the twelve apostles from among his disciples asking his heavenly Father, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" (Is 6:8). Then Jesus chose the apostles, appointed them to be with him, and sent them to villages and towns before he visited them as heralds to prepare them to receive his "good news." "As you go, make this proclamation: 'The kingdom of heaven is at hand... "Cure the sick, raise the dead, cleanse lepers, and drive out demons." Casting out demons also included liberating people from their evil habits and addictions which led them to sin.

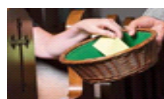
Jesus has commissioned or sent us to transform ourselves and others with the "Good News" of God's love, mercy, forgiveness, and salvation through Jesus His Son.

The Gospel of today is another reminder from God to each one of us that we have received grace and talents from God without charge, and so we must give others without charge through the generous sharing of what we have for others as Jesus did for the people of his time. When Jesus walked on the streets and saw people who were "like sheep without a shepherd" he was compassionate to them and taught them as he saw in each of them a sacred and holy child, image of God.

ST. ANTHONY OF PADUA, OUR PATRON SAINT

Anthony was born into a wealthy family in 1195 in Lisbon, Portugal and was raised in the church. He joined the Augustinian canons in 1210. In 1220 he joined the Franciscan order, hoping to preach to the Saracens (Muslims) and be martyred. On his way to Morocco, he became seriously ill and was forced to return home. However, his ship back to Portugal was blown off course and eventually landed in Sicily. Because of his continuing poor health, he was not allowed to pursue his missionary work among the Saracens. Instead, he taught theology at Bologna, Italy, and at Montpellier, Toulouse, and Puy-en-Velay in southern France, winning great admiration as a preacher. He died *en route* to Padua, Italy, at the age of 36 on June 13, 1231. Anthony was the most celebrated of St. Francis of Assisi's followers and had the reputation of a miracle worker. On January 16, 1946, Pope Pius XII declared him a doctor of the church and patron of the poor. In art he is shown with a book, a heart, a flame, a lily, or the child Jesus. His name is invoked for the return of lost property. **St. Anthony, Pray for us.**
