## FEARLESS WITNESSES AND MESSENGERS OF GOD

*Jeremiah 20.10-13; Psalm 69; Romans 5.12-15; Matthew 10.26-33*

As baptized Christians, we are continuing the witnessing mission of witnessing of Christ in the world. The Second Vatican Council taught the same that every Christian should be a living witness to Christ through living a life of faith and charity and by joining in worship and prayer.

Jeremiah's prophetic mission was filled with tormenting trials and intense suffering. He experienced humiliations and his own friends wished for his downfall. He complained and cursed the day he was born (Jer. 20.14-18). However, Jeremiah didn't give up as he experienced the power of God (Jer.20.7) while fulfilling his mission.

Jesus prepared his disciples, the twelve, for the mission. He knew that they were fearful and understood their fear and He took it seriously (Mt.10.16-23). Jesus was trying to give them courage and move them beyond fear as fear would make them unable to fulfil the mission. He repeatedly said not to be afraid of speaking in the light what He spoke in darkness, and proclaiming from housetops what was whispered by Him. The disciples must be bold enough to proclaim truth in all situations (Mt.10.26-28).

How can the disciples lay aside the fear and fulfill their mission? They were assured that they can count on the careful watchfulness of God like the One who takes good care of tiny sparrows and each hair on the head (Mt.10.29-31). We, the disciples, are of more value and have no need for any fear in proclaiming the truth anywhere in the world. With trust in God's Divine Providence and having no fear for the sufferings, trials, oppositions, rejections, persecutions, failure, relationship, challenges etc. we live our faith and become faithful heralds of God's message.

The disciples are called repeatedly to proclaim what He spoke and whispered to them and constantly journey with Him. If this journeying with Christ seems impossible, remember what He said, "With men it is impossible but not with God; for all things are possible with God" (Mk.10.27). We are disciples of Jesus. We trust and go fearlessly to be the messengers of His Good News.
