## LITURGY OF THE WORD 2025-2026

### SUNDAY: YEAR A WEEKDAY - YEAR 1

#### **First Reading:** (*Deut 8:2=3.14-16*).

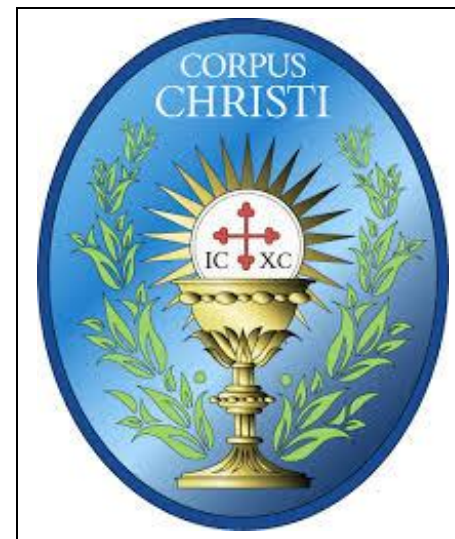
The author exhorts the people to remember that they are God's people who need to nourish themselves on his word.

#### **Second Reading:** (*1 Cor 10:16-17*).

In the Eucharist we all share the same bread and so, however many we are, we form one Body in Christ.

#### **Gospel:** (*Jn 6:51-58*).

As food and drink nourish the body, so Christ nourishes us for this life and eternal life.

## HOLY EUCHARIST - THE AWESOME SACRAMENT

*Deuteronomy 8.2-3, 14-16; Psalm 147; 1Corinthians 10. 16-17; John 6.51-59*

St. Thomas Aquinas called God as the *summum bonum* (the highest good). For him, the Eucharist is Christ himself as it represents the complete intersection of the human quest for goodness and God's self-revelation and called this sacrament "*tantum sacramentum*," the awesome sacrament. Today we celebrate the solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi), the Holy Eucharist.

In the Holy Eucharist, we have the nourishment for our minds, hearts, and spirits. Here we are called to experience the abiding presence of Christ with us. We have scriptural foundation for this awesome sacrament. Moses reminded the people that God directed their journey throughout the desert and when they thought they would die of starvation, God provided them with manna. The second reading is on the cup of blessing that we bless and the bread that we break. Because the loaf of bread is one, we who are many are one body, for we partake of the one loaf (1 Cor.10.16-17). In the Gospel, Jesus has explained to the people the new "manna" which nourishes and sustains in the spiritual being of its partakers (John 6.51-59).

Celebration of the feast of Corpus Christi is the celebration of Christ living among us. "Do this in memory of me." These words of Jesus after the Last Supper, tell us that the heart of the Eucharist is remembrance. Jesus asked us to remember his words, teachings, actions, his sufferings, death and resurrection, ascension, and the promise of his second coming. We form a single body, the Church, because we all share in one loaf and we drink one cup.

The people who were travelling were tired and hungry and were nourished by manna as we heard in first reading (Deuteronomy 8.2-3, 14-16). That manna could not give them everlasting life. The Eucharist, as we heard in the Gospel ((John 6.51-59), nourishes, and gives us eternal life. So, it is a wonderful Sacrament.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church presents the Eucharist as the "source and summit of the Christian life". It is Jesus who saves us; it is Jesus who comes to nourish and give the strength to live our everyday life facing all that come on our way, the challenges, the questions, the new needs, the problems. Eucharistic nourishment enables the Church to discern the best for humanity and the wisdom to respond to "the joys and the hopes, the griefs and the anxieties" of humanity.

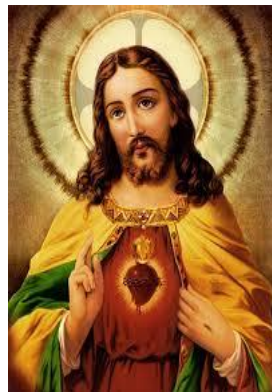
### CURA PASTORUM COLLECTION
