WEEKDAY - YEAR 1

First Reading: (1Kgs 19:9.11-13).
Fleeing for his life, the prophet Elijah takes refuge in a cave where he encounters God.

Second Reading: (Rom 9:1-5).
St. Paul tells us about the sorrow and anguish he suffers because his fellow Jews refused to accept Christ as the Messiah.

Gospel: (Mt 14:22-33).
When they are caught in high winds and rough seas, Jesus comes to the apostles; he calms their fears and brings them peace.



PRAYER AMIDST STORMS IN LIFE

1 Kings 19.9-13; Psalm 85.8-13; Romans 9.1-5; Matthew 14.22-33.

The messenger of Yahweh, Prophet Elijah, was against the idol worship and challenged the king and his people worshipping Baal. Queen Jezebel was unhappy with the prophet and wanted to kill him. The prophet was on the run for his life. As a discouraged, beaten, and broken man, Elijah prayed Yahweh to let him die. Yahweh sent the angel with food and drink and commanded him to go to mount Horeb, the mountain of God. He went and spent the night in the cave, and the Lord asked him to go out and stand on the mountain before the Lord. Elijah obeyed God. He witnessed great wind, earthquake, and fire but Yahweh was not there. God chose to manifest Himself to Elijah in a gentle breeze, in the “sound of sheer silence” (1 Kings 19:11-13). On the mount Horeb God revealed Him to Elijah and having received strength and comfort from the Living God Elijah continued his prophetic mission.

St. Paul experienced the power of God when he was going to Damascus to persecute the Christians. On the way, he was struck by the heavenly light and while lying on the ground (Acts.9.1-9) he witnessed the power of God. It was this Paul who wrote to the Church in Rome that he trusted the Lord Jesus and was not afraid of his sorrow and unceasing anguish (Rom.9.1-5).

Jesus was revealed to Peter and the other apostles in the turbulent sea where wind and waves beat them and, were full of fear as they were sinking. They were amazed to see Christ coming to them in the middle of the storm. Jesus calmed their fears and saved them (Mt.14.22-33).

God’s ways are mysterious. He was revealed to people on the sea, on land, and on the mountain. God is present where we least expect Him, although it may be a hidden and unseen presence. His presence is everywhere for those who can discern it and see events through the eyes of faith. God continues to reveal to us in many ways and forms with his love, care, power, grace, comfort, and courage. Let us discern Him and listen to Him speaking “Take heart (have courage); It is I; Do not be afraid” (Mt.14.27).
